SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of first aid measures:

Request medical assistance immediately, showing the SDS of this product.

By inhalation:

By ingestion/aspiration:

Request immediate medical assistance, showing the SDS of this product. 5.2 Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture:
